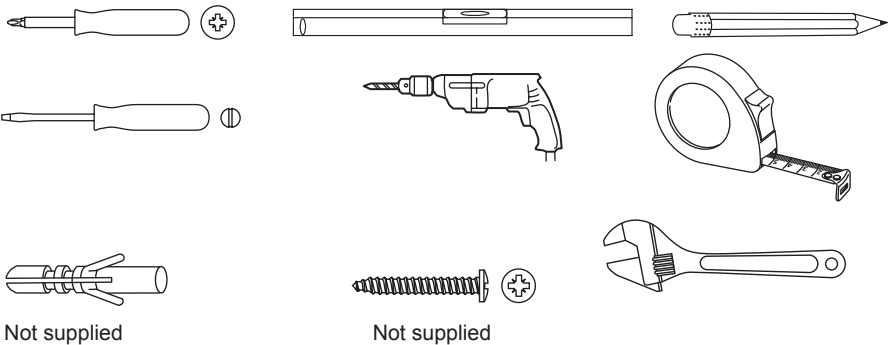

Getting started...

- All installation work must be carried out by a competent person or qualified electrician.
- This appliance must be installed correctly by a suitably qualified person, strictly following the manufacturer's instructions.

- ☒ This appliance complies with all current European safety legislation, however, the Manufacturer must emphasise that this compliance does not prevent the surfaces of the appliance from heating up during use and remaining hot during its operation.
- ☒ Accessible parts may become hot during use. Young children should be kept away. Care should be taken to avoid touching the appliance (e.g hob, cooker).
- ☒ Therefore, the Manufacturer highly recommends that this appliance be kept out of the reach of babies and small children.
- ☒ Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

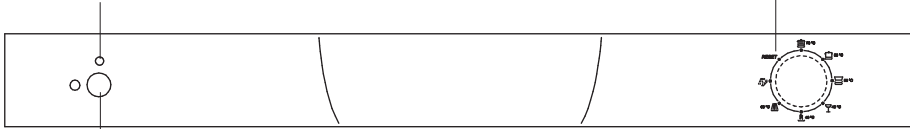



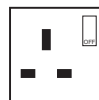

Operation



Warning: If the appliance is not operating properly or maintenance must be performed, disconnect the appliance from the power supply.



Arranging crockery, glasses, etc. in the dishwasher

Before placing the dishes in the dishwasher, remove larger food particles to prevent the filter from becoming clogged, which results in reduced performance.

If pots and pans have baked-on food that is extremely hard to remove, we recommend that they be soaked before washing. This will rule out the need for extra wash cycles.

Pull out the rack to load the dishwasher.

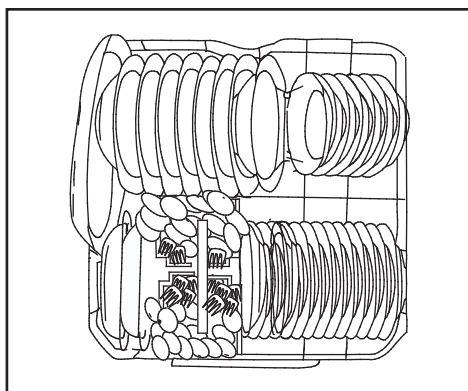
How to use the lower rack



Warning: knives and other utensils with sharp tips must be loaded into the basket with their tips pointing downwards or placed in a horizontal position.

We recommend that you place the most difficult to clean items on the bottom rack: pots, pans, lids, serving dishes and bowls.

Serving dishes and lids should be placed on the sides of the racks in order to avoid blocking the rotation of the top spray arm.



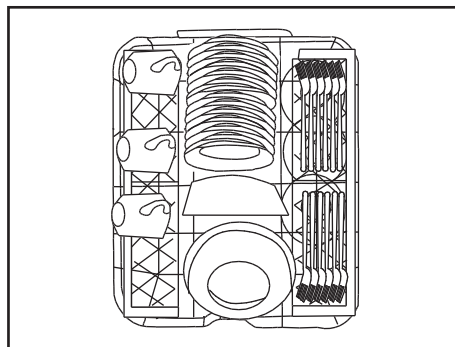
In more detail...

- Pots, serving bowls, etc. must always be placed face down.
- Deep pots should be slanted to allow the water to flow out.



How to use the upper rack

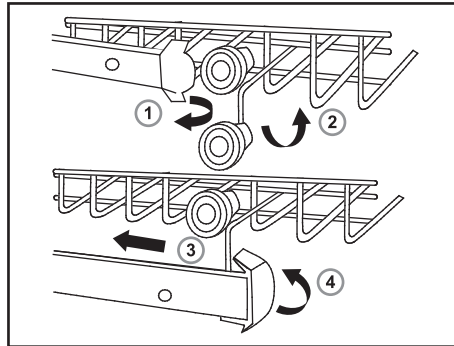
The upper rack is designed to hold more delicate and lighter objects, such as glasses, cups and saucers, plates, small bowls and shallow pans (provided they are not too dirty).



Position the dishes and cookware so that they do not get moved by the spray of water.

The upper rack can be height-adjusted using the knobs on both sides of the rack itself.

Adjust the upper basket to the higher level for more space to accommodate taller pans and trays in the lower basket.

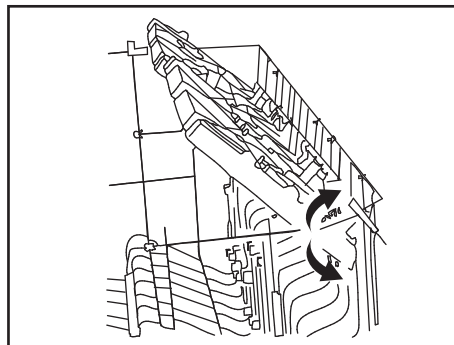


Shelf

Lean tall glasses and those with long stems against the shelf not against other items to be washed.

Place glasses, cups and small bowls on the additional cup rack.

The additional cup rack can be swivelled in or out as required.



Program selection



Warning: When the dishwasher power is on, the program that the knob indicates cannot be performed. Rotate the knob to another program and then back to the one required.

The most appropriate program can be identified by comparing the type of crockery, cutlery, etc. and the amount and condition of food remains with the details contained in the wash cycle table.

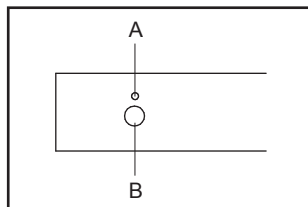
The corresponding program sequence, duration and consumption details are shown in the right half of the overview.

For example, use the “normal” program for dishes and utensils with plenty of food remains stuck on hard.

Program data

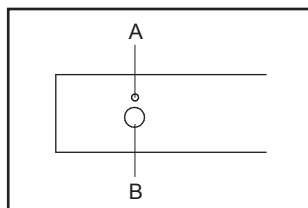
The program data indicated is based on standard operating conditions. Values may vary considerably according to:

- Different amounts of dishes
- Temperature of mains water supply
- Pressure of mains water supply
- Room temperature
- Fluctuations in mains voltage
- Machine-related factors (e.g. temperature, water volume, etc.)



Switching the dishwasher ON

- Turn on the tap.
- Close the door after loading the appliance.
- Set the On-Off button “B” to “On”. The status indicator “A” will light up.
- Rotate the knob to select the program required. After 3 seconds, the appliance emits a short warning signal and the program starts. Status indicator “A” will flash.



NOTE: After a washing program ends, the knob indicates the same position as the last washing program. To start another washing program, turn the knob to the reset position, then choose the next washing program.

End of program

Six beeps will indicate that the wash cycle has finished.

Switching the dishwasher OFF



Caution: When the appliance is already running, press button "B" for 3 seconds and all of the settings will be cancelled.

Several minutes after the program has ended:

- Set On-Off button to Off.
- Open the door.
- Turn the water tap off.
- Remove dishes, etc. when they have cooled down.

Interrupting the program



Caution: There is a risk of water being sprayed from inside the appliance. Do not open door fully until the spray arm has stopped rotating.

When you open the door, the dishwasher will beep two times every thirty seconds.

If the appliance has already heated up or if the hot water is switched ON and the appliance door then opened, leave the door ajar for several minutes and then close. Otherwise, the appliance door may open due to expansion.

Cancelling or modifying a cycle

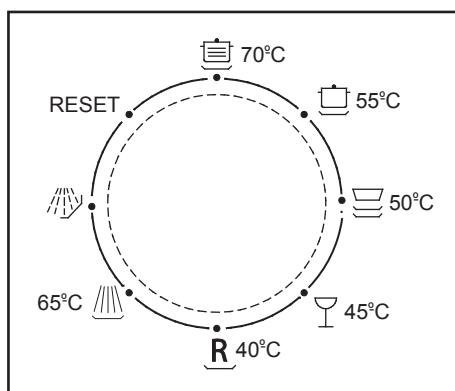
A current cycle can be modified if it has only been running for a short time. Otherwise, the detergent may have already been used and the appliance may have already drained the washing water.

If this is the case, the detergent dispenser must be refilled (see the "Loading the detergent").

To modify a cycle that is already running, follow the instructions given in the "Reset drain function" and select the program required (see the "Switching the dishwasher ON").

Reset drain function

You can use the Reset drain function to stop the washing cycle running by turning the knob to -RESET- and the appliance will stop the drain phase after a few minutes.

**Care**

Damaged power cables must be replaced by a competent person or qualified electrician.



For indoor use only.

Tips for saving energy

If only a small number of dishes have been loaded into the dishwasher, selecting a program that operates at the next lowest temperature, as this should be sufficient.

Loading the salt



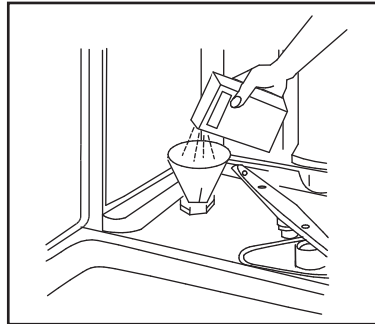
Caution: To prevent the formation of rust, load the salt just before you begin a wash cycle.

The hardness of the water varies from place to place. If hard water is used in the dishwasher, deposits will form on the dishes and utensils.

The appliance is equipped with a special softener that uses a salt specifically designed to eliminate lime scale and minerals from the water.

Always use salt intended for use with dishwashers.

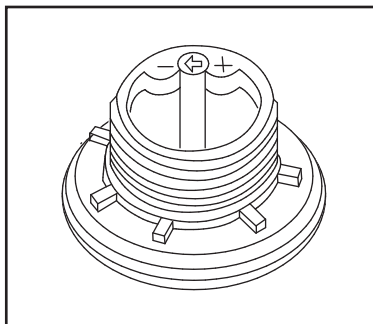
- Remove the lower rack and then unscrew and remove the cap from the salt container.
- If you are filling the container for the first time, fill it with water. Place the end of the funnel (supplied) into the hole and introduce about 2 kg of salt. It is normal for a small amount of water to come out of the salt container.
- Carefully screw the cap back on.



The dishwasher is designed to allow for the amount of salt consumed to be adjusted based on the hardness of the water used. This is intended to optimise and customise the level of salt consumption so that it remains at a minimum.

To adjust salt consumption, proceed as follows:

- Unscrew the cap from the salt container.
- There is a ring on the container with an arrow on it.
- If necessary, turn the ring in a counter-clockwise direction from the "-" setting towards the "+" sign, based on the hardness of the water being used.



The default setting of the water softening system is -. If using multi-functional tablets, fill the salt dispenser and set the adjuster to -. If the hardness of the water is greater than 60°FH, set it to +.

Loading the rinse aid



Caution: Proper dosage of the rinse aid improves drying. If water droplets remain on the dishes or spotting occurs, the dosage adjuster should be turned to a higher setting. If the dishes have white streaks, turn the dosage adjuster to a lower setting.

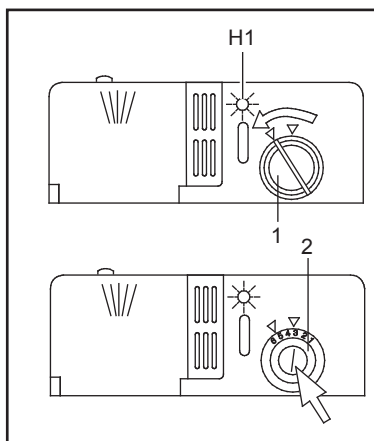
This product makes dishes sparkle and helps them to dry without spotting.

The dispenser is located on the inside panel of the door.

When the low rinse aid indicator "H" on the control panel and the mechanical indicator "H1" on the dispenser light up, you must load rinse aid.

Regardless of the type of detergent dispenser installed in your appliance, you must proceed as indicated below when loading the rinse aid. To open the dispenser, turn cap -1- in a counter-clockwise direction and then pour in the rinse aid, making sure not to overfill.

The amount of rinse aid used for each cycle can be regulated by turning the dosage adjustor -2- located beneath cap -1- using a screwdriver. There are 6 different settings. The normal dosage setting is 3.



Loading the detergent

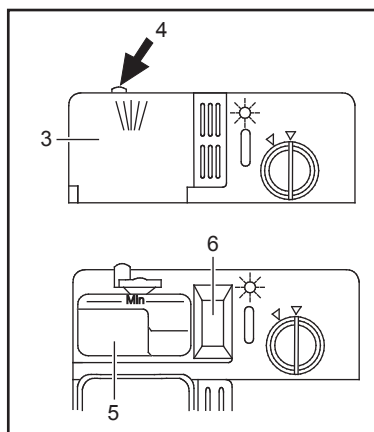


Caution: Remove any excess detergent on the edges of the dispenser for easier cover closure.

Detergent specifically intended for use with dishwashers must be used.

The dispenser must be refilled before the start of each wash cycle following the instructions provided in the "Program overview". The detergent dispenser is located on the inside panel of the door.

- To open cover -3- on the dispenser, press button -4-.
- The detergent for the wash cycle should be poured into compartment -5-.
- The detergent for the pre-wash cycle should be poured into compartment -6-.
- After the detergent has been placed in the dispenser, close the cover and press down until it clicks into place.



What you should not put into the dishwasher

Cutlery and tableware manufactured entirely or partly from wood. They become faded and unsightly.

Delicate decorative glassware and vases, special antiques or irreplaceable china.

The decorative patterns on these items are not dishwasher-proof.

Copper and pewter utensils are also not suitable.

Decorative patterns printed or painted onto the surface of crockery, glasses, etc., aluminium and silver items tend to become discoloured or faded if washed in the dishwasher. Some types of glass can become opaque in appearance after they have been washed many times in a dishwasher.

Our recommendation

Only purchase table or kitchenware that has been confirmed as being dishwasher-proof.

Damage to glassware and other dishes:

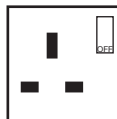
- Type of glass or manufacturing process
- Chemical composition of detergent
- Water temperature and duration of dishwasher program

Suggested remedy:

- Use glassware or porcelain dishes that have been marked 'dishwasher-proof' by the manufacture.
- Use a mild detergent that is described as 'kind to dishes'. If necessary, seek further information from detergent manufacturers.
- Select a program with a low temperature and as short a duration as possible.
- To prevent damage, take glass and cutlery out of the dishwasher as soon as possible after the program has ended.

Moving the appliance

Warning: Always switch off the electricity supply and unplug before performing maintenance work. In the event of a fault, contact customer services



If the appliance must be moved, try to keep it in a vertical position. If absolutely necessary, it can be positioned on its back.

Long periods without use

When you go on holiday, run a wash cycle with the dishwasher empty and then remove the plug from the socket, the door of the appliance slightly ajar.

This will help the seals last longer and prevent odours from forming inside the appliance.

No solvents or abrasive cleaning products

Do not use solvents or abrasive cleaning products to clean the exterior and rubber parts of the dishwasher. Instead use only a soft cloth and warm soapy water and wipe dry with clean soft cloths.

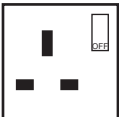
To remove spots or stains from the interior surface, use a cloth dampened with water and a little white vinegar or a cleaning product made specifically for dishwashers.

Seals

One of the factors causing odours to form in the dishwasher is food that remains trapped in the seals. Regular cleaning with a damp sponge will prevent this from occurring.

Maintenance

Regular inspection and maintenance of your appliance helps to prevent problems. This saves time and aggravation. You should therefore carefully inspect the inside of your dishwasher from time to time.

Cleaning the appliance

Warning: Always switch off the electricity supply and unplug before performing maintenance work. In the event of a fault, contact customer services



Caution: Do not use solvents of any kind inside your dishwasher. They could cause an explosion danger.

Unplug the machine during cleaning and maintenance.

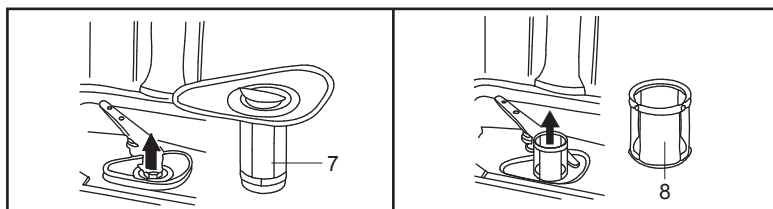
Check that no grease or scale has accumulated on the inside of the dishwasher. If you discovered any deposits clean the interior of the dishwasher thoroughly with a dishwasher detergent solution.

Use a soft cloth dampened with liquid soap to clean the machine casing and rubber components. Do not use organic chemicals or corrosive solvents.

Cleaning the filter



Caution: The filter must be in place or it may lead to leakage. Place a container under the drain pump filter to collect any excess water that may be released from the drain pump when the filter is removed.

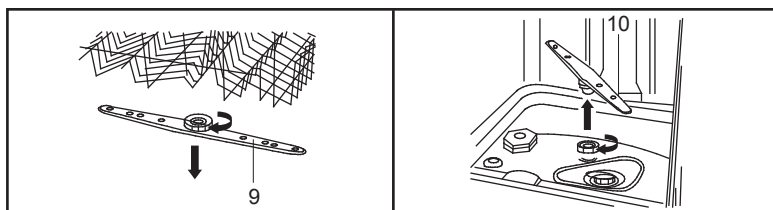


Filters -7- and -8- prevent larger particles of food in the water from reaching the pump. These particles may occasionally block the filters.

1. When the appliance has finished washing, check the filters for particles of food and, if required, clean.
2. After unscrewing the coarse micro-filter -7-, the filter unit -8- can be removed. Remove any particles of food and rinse the filters under running water.
3. Insert the filter unit -8- and tighten the coarse micro-filter.

Spray arms

Lime scale and remains of food in the washing water can block the nozzles in the spray arms -9- and -10- and the arm mountings.



- Inspect the nozzles in the spray arms for holes blocked by remains of food.
- If necessary, pull the lower arm -10- upwards and lift it off.
- Unscrew the upper spray arm -9-.
- Clean both spray arms under running water.
- Refit the spray arms. Ensure that the lower arm is locked into place and the upper one is screwed tight.
- Ensure that the power supply is turned off prior to removal and cleaning of any internal parts.

Anti-Flooding protection

The dishwasher is equipped with a system that stops the supply of water in the event of a problem with the water supply hose or leaks within the unit, in order to prevent damage to your home.

If for any reason the box containing the electrical components happens to be damaged, turn off the power supply and immediately remove the plug for the appliance from the socket. In order to ensure the anti-flooding feature operates properly, box with the water supply hose must be attached to the water supply tap.

No other type of connection is acceptable.

The water supply hose must under no circumstances be cut, as it contains live electrical parts.

If the length of the hose is not adequate to make a proper connection, the hose must be replaced with one that is long enough.

This hose is available upon request from specialised retailers and approved service centres.

In more detail...

Troubleshooting

Experience has shown that you can resolve most problems that arise during normal daily usage yourself, without having to call out customer services. Not only does this save costs, but it also means that the appliance is available for use again that much sooner.

The following list of common occurrences and their remedies should help you identify the causes of most problems.

Fault	Cause	Solution
Appliance does not start up (when the appliance is switched on)	Fault with fuse in mains electricity supply	Disconnect from the mains and check the fuse
	Plug not inserted in wall socket	Plug appliance in and make sure switch is on
	Appliance door not closed properly	Close door correctly
	Program button has not been pressed	Make sure program button is pressed
	Water tap not turned on	Turn on water tap
	Blocked strainer in water intake hose	Refer to care and maintenance section
Unusual amount of foam is creased (during washing)	Normal washing up liquid has been poured into the rinse-aid container	Remove any spilled rinse aid with a cloth as it could otherwise lead to excessive foaming during the next washing cycle
Appliance stops suddenly while washing is taking place (during washing)	Cut off electricity supply to appliance	Check mains electricity supply
	Water supply has been interrupted	Check mains water supply. Make sure cold water fill pipe isn't obstructed
Knocking sound can be heard while washing is taking place (during washing)	A spray arm is knocking against the dishes inside the appliance	Reload the appliance

Rattling sound can be heard while washing is taking place (during washing)	Crockery has not been stacked properly inside the appliance	Reload the crockery
White stains are left on crockery, glasses have a milky appearance	Not enough detergent added to dispenser compartment	If you used a phosphate-free detergent, try a detergent containing phosphates and compare results
	Amount of rinse-aid set too low	Adjust rinse-aid to a higher setting

If you take all these checks and the dishwasher still does not function or your dishwasher have any other error display:

1. You can power the dishwasher OFF, and wait a few minutes.
2. You can power the dishwasher ON.
3. Try it again, if the dishwasher still does not function and/or the problem persists, contact the customer service center and provide them with the following information:
 - The nature of the problem.
 - The model type number (Mod...) and the serial number (S/N...), which are indicated on the plate located on the side of the inner part of the door.

Water connection - cold fill



Warning: The appliance is to be connected to the water mains using new hose sets. Old hose sets should not be reused.

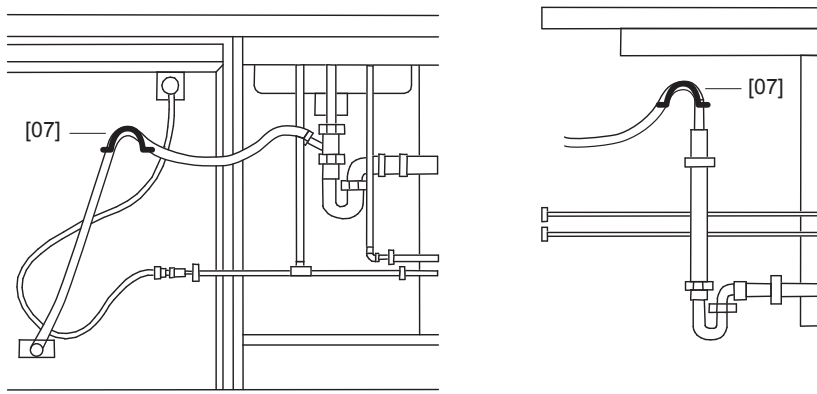


1. Connect the hose to the outlet of the machine.
2. Connect the water supply hose to a threaded 3/4 BSP connector on the water supply, making sure that it is fastened tightly in place.

If the water pipes are new or have not been used for an extended period of time, let the water run to make sure that the water is clear and free of impurities.

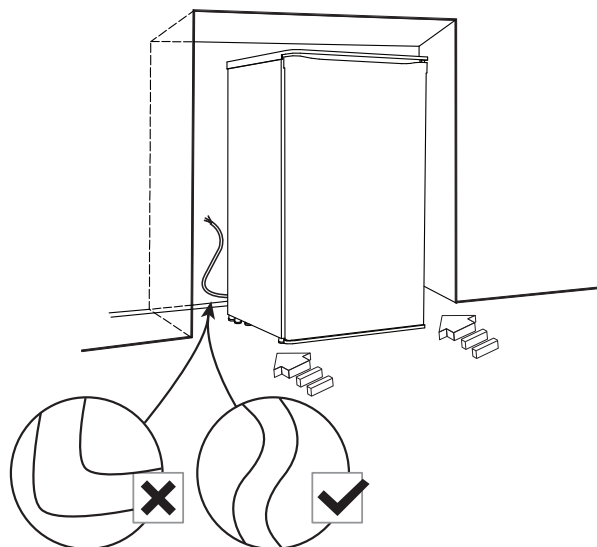
If this precaution is not taken, there is a risk that the water inlet may become blocked and damage the appliance.

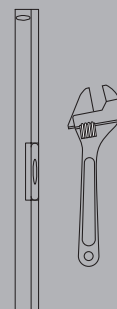
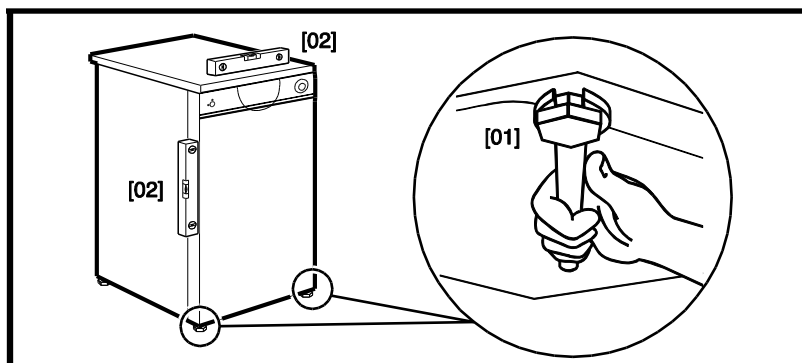
