Before you start

- Please read these instructions carefully before using this appliance. The instructions contain important information which will help you get the best out of the appliance and ensure safe and proper installation, use and maintenance.
- Keep this manual in a convenient place so you can always refer to it for the safe and proper use of the appliance.
- If you sell the appliance, give it away, or leave it behind when you move house, make sure you also pass on this manual so that the new owner can become familiar with the appliance and safety warnings.

This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:

- Staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments;
- Farm houses ;
- by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments;
- Bed and breakfast type environments.

Safety

Note!



The appliance was designed for domestic use inside the house. It is not intended for commercial or industrial use.

Before switching on the appliance for the first time

Do...

- Make sure all packaging is removed.
- Make sure that the mains voltage and frequency is compatible with the electrical information on the appliance rating plate.
- Use a separate earthed socket for the power supply. The appliance must be earthed.
- Make sure the plug is easily accessible.
- Hold the plug and not the electric cable when unplugging the power supply.
- Make sure not to damage the electric cable and the plug. If they become damaged have them replaced by a qualified person.
- If you find a leak, turn the electricity supply off. Turn the water supply off. Stop the water leak, Ensure there are no water leaks before turning on the electricity supply.

Do not...

- Install or use the appliance where the ambient temperature is below 5°C.
- Use multi-plug adapters or extension cables.
- Put flammable products or items that have been wet with flammable products in, near or on the appliance.
- Use water spray or steam to clean the appliance.

During daily use**Do...**

- Put knives and cutlery with sharp points in the cutlery basket with the points down or in a horizontal position.

Do not...

- Open the door while a programme is in operation. The appliance can release hot steam.

Do not...


-  Leave the door in the open position since this could present a tripping hazard.
-  Allow children or pets near dishwasher when the door is open.
-  Sit or stand on the open door.
-  Remove the dishes from the appliance until the programme is completed. There can still be detergent on the dishes.
-  Drink the water in the appliance. The water may be contaminated with detergent residues.



Note: This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

In more detail...

Status indication

	Multitab	Activate this option only when you use the combi detergent tablets. This option decreases the flow of rinse aid and salt. Related indication. The programme duration can increase.
	Half load	Use this option if you have only a few items to wash. This will save water, energy and time. If you use powder detergent use a little less detergent than for a full load.

Option indication

	Delay start	You can delay the start of a programme in 1 hour steps up to 24 hours. Check the according paragraph under "Daily use".
	Extra Hygiene	This option gives more hygienic results. During the rinsing phase, the temperature stays at 70°C for approximately 10 minutes.
	Extra shine	This option reduces spots on glassware and dinnerware. The option adds an extra intermediate rinse.

Deficit indication

	Salt	If the indicator lights up: Softener salt is empty! This indicator is off while the programme operates.
	Rinse aid	If the indicator lights up: Rinse aid is empty! This indicator is off while the programme operates.
	Water	If the indicator lights up: The appliance does not fill with water. See <i>Troubleshooting</i> section.

Programmes

The water pressure and temperature, the variations of the mains supply, the options and the quantity of dishes can change the programme duration and performance. Consumption values are measured under standard conditions. The display always shows the related programme duration.

* Remark

- 1) The appliance senses the type of soil and the quantity of items in the baskets. It automatically adjusts the temperature and quantity of water, energy consumption and programme duration.
- 2) Standard programme for the Energy Labelling according to 2010/30 EU. With this programme you have the most efficient use of water and energy consumption for dishes with normal soil.
- 3) With this programme you can wash a load with fresh soil. It gives good washing results in a short time.
- 4) Use this programme to quickly rinse the dishes. This prevents the remaining food to bond on the dishes and bad odours to come out from the appliance. Do not use detergent with this programme!

Water softener

Hard water contains a high quantity of minerals that can cause damage to the appliance and bad washing results. The water softener neutralises these minerals in coaction with salt specifically designed for a dishwasher. To make sure that the water softener uses the correct quantity of dishwasher salt and water it should be thoroughly adjusted to your local water hardness.

* Remark

- 1) Factory default setting for powder detergent.
- 2) Factory default setting for combi detergent tablets.
- 3) Indicator for Salt is off. No usage of salt at this level.



Note!

If you use combi detergent tablets (multitabs), activate the Multitab option. These tablets contain detergent, salt, rinse aid and other added agents. Be sure that these tablets are applicable to the water hardness in your area. Refer to the instructions on its packaging.

Different settings for water softener

There are 2 different softener settings related to the used kind of detergent:

Detergent powder setting

- The salt is added from the water softener only.
With the multitab indicator **OFF** the multitab option is off.
Factory default setting: *H6*, multitab off.

Multitab setting

- The salt is added from the water softener in addition to the multitab salt.
With the multitab indicator **ON**, you have selected the multitab option.
Factory default setting: *H2*

While your setting for detergent powder is mandatory, factory default setting for multitab will normally perform well.

For adjustments see *How to adjust a default setting* section.


How to fill the salt container



Caution!

Only use dishwasher salt. Other products can cause damage to the appliance!

Water and salt can come out from the salt container when you fill it.
Risk of corrosion. To prevent it, run a programme immediately after filling.



- Turn the cap anticlockwise and open the salt container.
- Only for the first time:
Put 1 litre of water into the salt container.
- Fill the salt container with dishwasher salt.
- Remove the salt around the opening of the salt container.
- Turn the cap clockwise to close and seal the salt container.

How to fill the Rinse Aid dispenser




Caution!

Only use rinse aid for dishwashers.
Other product can cause damage to the appliance!



Note!

The rinse aid is added during the last rinsing phase. It helps to dry the dishes without streaks and stains.



1. Press the release button (**B**) to open the lid.
2. Fill the rinse aid dispenser (**A**) no more than the mark, "max".
3. Remove spilled rinse aid with an absorbent cloth to prevent creation of foam.
4. Close the lid. Make sure that the release button locks into position.

Different Rinse Aid settings

If you think it necessary to adjust the rinse aid see *Troubleshooting* section to know about the necessary quantity.

You can adjust the quantity of rinse aid between **d1** and **d7**.



Note!

If you set the position **1**, you switch off the usage of rinse aid and you switch off the indicator for rinse aid.

Factory default setting is **6**.

For adjustments see *How to adjust a default setting* section.

How to adjust a default setting

To get best results in each programme there are well defined specific default settings. If there is no special requirement default settings are recommended. You may adjust three default settings in one menu: Rinse aid dosage, buzzer ON/OFF (sound at programme end), water softener setting.

For rinse aid setting **dx**, the following step can be selected:

d1:	rinseaid dosage will be 0 ml; Indication for rinse aid will be deactivated
d2:	rinseaid dosage will be 1 ml;
d3:	rinseaid dosage will be 2 ml;
d4:	rinseaid dosage will be 3 ml;
d5:	rinseaid dosage will be 4 ml;
d6:	rinseaid dosage will be 5 ml;
d7:	rinseaid dosage will be 6 ml;

For acoustical end signal beep **bx**, the following choice can be selected:

b0:	acoustical end signal off
b1:	acoustical end signal on

- The appliance has to be switched off. Press **RESET** button for about 3 seconds. The programme indicators light up. The flashing one indicates which default setting could be currently changed.

- First indicator: Menu for rinse aid dosage .
- Second indicator: Menu for buzzer indication .
- Third indicator: Menu for water softener adjustment .

Press **RESET** button to select the setting for rinse aid/buzzer/water softener.

- First indicator blinks: Press ON/OFF indicator for rinse aid dosage setting from **d1** to **d7**.
 - Second indicator blinks: Press ON/OFF indicator for buzzer setting from **b0** to **b1** or display shows value for buzzer ON (1)/ OFF (0).
 - Third indicator blinks: Press ON/OFF indicator for water setting from **H1** to **H9** or display shows value for water softener setting (1-9).
- To select another default setting press sequentially the **RESET** button.
 - When you finish the setting, press **ON/OFF** button around 5 seconds for confirmation.

Using the dishwasher

1. Open the water tap.
2. Press the **ON/OFF** button to activate the appliance.
 - If the salt indicator is on, fill the salt container right to the top. Press and hold the **RESET** button for 3 seconds to confirm the refilling of softener salt.
 - If the rinse aid indicator is on, fill the rinse aid container up to the "max" mark. Press and hold the **RESET** button for 3 seconds to confirm the refilling of rinse aid.
3. Press **ON/OFF** button to select "1/2", "multi-tab" if applicable.
4. Press programme/reset button for program selection.
5. To select "delay start", "extra hygiene", "extra shine" function if applicable, press option button and the relevant operation indication light is flashing. Then press option change button for selection.

Delay start function. - The selection is from 0 hour to 24 hour. For example, if you select 1H, the appliance will turn on after one hour.

Extra Hygiene function - Press button 6 twice to light on this function and then press button 7 to activate this.

Extra Shine function - Press button 6 three times to light on this function and then press button 7 to activate this.

6. When the program is set, close the door and the appliance will operate as per the setting.



Note!

During operation, press **ON/OFF** button to switch off the operation or cancel the setting.



Note!

Refill such a container always completely before you press the **RESET** button. Failure to fill the containers completely at this initial stage could lead to poor washing results at a later date.

7. Load the baskets.
8. Add the detergent.
9. According to the type of load and soil select
 - a programme
 - possibly a start time delay
 - possibly an option
10. Close the door and the programme starts.
11. After the programme finishes you can unload the baskets.
12. Close the water tap.


Load the baskets

**Note!**

With delicate glasses and porcelain make sure they are labelled "dishwasher-proof".


- Do not put in the appliance items made of wood, horn, aluminium, pewter copper or cast iron.
- Do not put in the appliance items that can absorb water (sponges, household cloths, etc).
- Only use the appliance to wash items that are "dishwasher-safe".
- Remove remaining food from items prior to loading.
- Items with burnt on food should be pre soaked to soften residues.
- Put hollow items (cups, glasses and pans) with the opening down.
- Mix spoons with other cutlery to prevent them to bond together.
- Make sure that cutlery and dishes do not bond together.
- Make sure that glasses do not touch other glasses.
- Put small items in the cutlery basket.
- Put light items in the upper basket. Make sure they can not move.
- Before each programme start check if spray arms can move freely.

Cutlery basket



1. Mix spoons with other cutlery to prevent them bonding together.
2. Place cutlery with the points down for reasons of safety.
3. Place long items in a horizontal position so the spray arms can move freely.

Upper basket



1. Place normal or lightly soiled utensils (like breakfast plates and glasses) in the upper basket.
2. Place small items on the cup holder.

Adjust height of upper basket


To create more space in the upper or lower basket you can adjust the height of the upper basket.



Caution!


Only adjust the height if the basket is empty. Otherwise the basket might be too heavy to secure the new position. Always make sure that both sides of the basket are at the same height after an adjustment.

Lift basket




1. Pull out the upper basket.
2. Hold the basket on both sides on the edge above the lever.
3. Lift the basket till you hear a click.
4. Push down the basket with light pressure to check secure adjustment.

Knife rack




For best washing results place your table knives in the knife rack.



Place all long items like soup ladle, spatula, egg whisk, etc. in the knife rack.

**Caution!**

Place your sharp/longer kitchen knives into the knife rack.



For more space you can take the spikes out.

Bottom basket

Place heavily soiled items (like pots and pans or dinner plates) in the bottom basket. The more powerful spray jets provide a better dish washing result.



Note!


If you hear knocking noises during operation: Check spray arm clearance and that your dishes and glassware are in a firm position.

Detergent



Caution!

Only use dishwasher detergent or tablets.



1. Open the dishwasher door fully open (horizontal). Press the release button (A) to open the lid.
2. Put the detergent into compartment (B) (If you use detergent tablets, put the tablet in the compartment (B)).
3. If the programme has a prewash phase, put a small quantity of detergent on the inner part of the appliance door (C).
4. Close the lid. Make sure that the release button locks into position.

Multitab

These detergent tablets combine detergent, rinse aid and dishwasher salt. Some types of tablets can contain additional agents.



Caution!

Only use detergent tablets, that contain dishwasher salt or another water softener. If you have very soft water you should use tablets without water softener.



Note!

Recommendation:

Make sure the rinse aid dispenser is full.
Adjust the rinse aid setting to 2.

Operation

Care and maintenance

End of programme

When the programme is completed, you will hear an acoustic signal.

1. Open the appliance door.
 - Optional: Press **ON/OFF** button to switch off the appliance.
 - For better drying results, keep the appliance door ajar for some minutes.
 - Let the dishes become cold before you remove them from the appliance. Hot dishes damage more easily.
 - First remove the items from the lower basket, then from the upper basket.



Note!

There can be water on the sides and on the door of the appliance. Stainless steel becomes cool more quickly than the dishes.

2. Close the door.
3. Close the water tap.

Care and maintenance

Inspect your appliance at regular intervals. This saves time and prevents problems.



Caution!

Never clean the appliance with a steam cleaner.
Never use bleach or other chlorinated detergents.

External cleaning


- Clean the appliance with a damp soft cloth.
- Only use neutral detergents. Do not use abrasive products, abrasive cleaning pads or solvents.
- Clean the door seal with a damp soft cloth.

Cleaning the filters




Note!


Dirty filters and clogged spray arms will result in poor washing results. Make a check regularly and, if necessary, clean them.



1. Turn the filter **A** anti-clockwise and remove it.



2. To disassemble the filter **A** pull apart **A1** and **A2**.
3. Remove the filter **B**.
4. Wash the filters with water.



5. Put the filter **B** to its initial position.
6. Assemble the filter **A** and put it into position in filter **B**. Turn it clockwise until it locks.




Caution!

An incorrect position of the filters can cause poor washing results and damage to the appliance.

Cleaning the spray arms

**Note!**

If the holes in the spray arms are clogged, you can remove the spray arms for more easy cleaning.

**Upper spray arm**

1. Turn screw fastening anti clockwise to remove spray arm.
2. Remove remaining parts of food remnants with a thin pointed object.
3. Flush with water and check all the holes are clear.
4. Refit spray arm.

Lower spray arm

1. Pull vertical at the centre to remove spray arm.
2. Remove remaining parts of food remnants with a thin pointed object.
3. Flush with water and check all the holes are clear.
4. Place spray arm at the centre with a light push.

Troubleshooting

Many problems could be solved by yourself without calling an engineer. In case of malfunction, please check carefully the list and possible solutions below before you contact Customer Services.

Problem	Possible cause	Possible solution
The programme does not start.	Appliance door is open.	Close the appliance door.
	Delay start is set.	Refer to displayed time.
	Mains plug is not connected in the mains socket. Fuse in the house circuit is damaged.	Connect the mains plug. Replace the fuse.
	UK plugs according to BS1363 only: Fuse in the plug is damaged.	Replace the fuse.

For all other Alarm codes:

1. Note Alarm code.
2. Contact Customer Service. See *Guarantee* section.

Washing results are not satisfactory

Problem	Possible cause	Possible solution
Remains of food are stuck to the dishes, cutlery, etc.	Dishwasher not loaded properly. Water jets could not reach all parts of the dishes, etc. Too many items in rack.	Reload the appliance.
	Items in rack touching each other.	Reload the appliance.
	Not enough detergent added to dispenser.	Add more detergent.
	Selected wash program not intensive enough.	Select the intensive wash program.
	Filters blocked.	Clear the obstruction.
	Filters incorrectly fitted.	Refer to <i>Care and maintenance</i> section.
Dishes, cutlery, etc. have not been dried.	Amount of rinse-aid set too low.	Alter the amount of rinse-aid.
	Items removed from dishwasher too soon.	Program must complete its cycle.
Glasses have a dull appearance.	Amount of rinse-aid set too low.	Alter the amount of rinse-aid.
Tea stains or traces of lipstick have not been completely removed.	Detergent has insufficient bleaching effect.	Use a more powerful detergent.
	Washing temperature set too low.	Set to a high temperature.
Traces of rust on cutlery.	Cutlery not sufficiently rustproof.	Buy dishwasher safe cutlery.
	Lid on salt container not screwed tight.	Make sure the salt container lid is secure.
	Too much salt spilt while filling container.	Take care when filling the container.

Smears left behind on glasses and cutlery; glasses have acquired a metallic appearance.	Amount of rinse-aid set too high.	Adjust the rinse-aid to a lower setting.

	Mechanism is clogged with remnants of detergent.	Clean compartment.
Remnants of detergent stuck inside dispenser.	Compartment was damp when it was filled up with detergent. Compartment must be dry before detergent is added.	Clean, dry and refill.
Water remains inside appliance after programme has ended.	Blockage or kink in drainage hose.	Check drainage hose for blockage and reposition.
	Filters are blocked.	Refer to <i>Care and maintenance</i> section.
	The programme is still running. Wait for the programme to end.	Close door and wait for program to finish.

Waste connection

Insert the drain hose into a drain pipe with a minimum diameter of 4cm, making sure to avoid bending or crimping. When the waste hose of the washing machine is connected beneath the sink, fit a siphon trap (accessory not included) (U-bend) with a connecting piece for the drain hose (u-bend fixing screw is not provided).



Note!

The free end of the hose must be at a height between 40 and 100 cm and must not be immersed in water.

Anti flood system

The dishwasher is equipped with a system that stops the supply of water in the event of a problem with the water supply hose or leaks within the unit, in order to prevent damage to your home.

In the event of a fault the safety valve immediately interrupts the supply of water, the drain pump is activated and a audible tone can be heard.

Remove the sink plug when the appliance drains. This prevents water to go back to the appliance.

Once the appliance is fully drained switch the appliance off at the **ON/OFF** button. Disconnect the plug from the mains supply and check the fill and drain hoses for leaks. If no leaks can be seen please call Customer Services.
